Study area: -

Dariyawal village is situated in Jind tehsil of district Jind. It lies about 8 km west to Jind. It is linked by Jind and railway road and has good bus services.



The total population is 3100 of which 1687 are males and 1413 are females. There are 1460 voters in this village. Jind is mainly used for purchasing and selling:-

The village is inhabited by a number of communities but Jaat are numerically dominant community. 257 households belong to Jaat community and agriculture and livestock are the main source of their livelihood the village has 43 household of Chamar community which is largest social group. People of these households are mainly engaged is agriculturally as wage labourers

Objectives;

The present study aims to carry out the following objectives: -

1. To study the gap in the socio-economic conditions across all the communities in rural areas.
2. To examine the degree of awareness towards marriage among all communities.
3. To identify the level of education among different communities group.

Data base:

The present study is based on the primarily data collected through a household survey. The survey was conducted on sample bases in which every fifth household is survey.
